

## Adobe Audition - Quick Reference Guide

1. Start:
  - a. To start a new project, **File>New> Multitrack Session** (Ctrl/Cmd+N) to create a session with multiple tracks.
  - b. To record audio into Audition, choose **File>New>Audio File**.
2. Rename a track:
  - a. Double click a track's name to change it.
3. Delete tracks:
  - a. Select track, select **Multitrack > Track > Delete Selected Track**
4. Import Audio to project:
  - a. Open "Media Browser", and find the files you want to import. Drag into project.
  - b. Open Finder/Explorer, and locate the files. Drag onto track in project.
  - c. The Files panel (Window>Files) shows all files in the current project (Note: if you .
5. Adjust volume for a clip:
  - a. Drag the yellow line up and down within the track.
6. Adjust fades for a clip:
  - a. Drag the grey box near the start/end of a selected clip. Drag up-down to change fade shape.
7. Edit clips/Remove audio from a clip
  - a. Use Razor tool (shortcut: R) to split a clip into parts.
  - b. To remove a section and automatically move the remaining audio to fill its place, right click and choose **Ripple Delete**. The Ripple Delete Time Selection ... options will ripple delete time from the current clip, track, or session overall.
8. Select clips:
  - a. Right-click, **Select>Select Clips To End Of Track** to select all clips to the right of wherever you clicked. Right click, **Select > Select Clips To End of Session** to select clips on all tracks to the end of the session.
9. Add effects:
  - a. The Effects Rack (**Window > Effects Rack**) lets you add audio effects to a clip/track. Choose "Clip Effects" or "Track Effects", then click the triangle next to an effects slot to choose an effect to add.
10. Noise Reduction
  - a. Add the "Adaptive Noise Reduction" effect to a clip for automatic noise reduction.
  - b. Open the clip in Waveform view (**View > Waveform Editor**, or double-click the clip name), then select a span of time with only background noise (e.g. no talking). Right click, **Capture Noise Print** (shift+P). Then, **Effects > Noise Reduction/Restoration > Noise Reduction** (process). Click the play button at the bottom of the popup to preview the noise reduction. When you're happy, click *Apply*. NOTE: because background noise changes from clip to clip, you should always re-capture a noise print for every new clip you apply noise reduction to.
11. Export
  - a. When it's time to export, choose **File > Export > Multitrack Mixdown > Entire Session**. Give the file a name, choose where to save it, and click OK.
